

## Withdrawing a Manuscript

### Why withdraw a manuscript?

Manuscripts are almost always withdrawn by author request. Withdrawing a paper removes it from peer review. Withdrawn papers cannot be resubmitted under the same manuscript id as the original submission. If the author later wishes to resubmit a new version of the paper, they must do so as a new submission.

Reasons an author might request a withdrawal of their manuscript include:

- If the author decides not to resubmit after a revision decision was made.
- If the author has significant changes to the author supplied information, such as a dispute over authorship or changes to funding.
- If the author encounters a setback that will prevent a timely return of a revision.
- If the author discovers additional findings or an error in their data which would require significant changes to the paper. If the changes are minor and would not significantly change the paper or its conclusions, an unsubmit might be more appropriate. ### Requesting an unsubmit

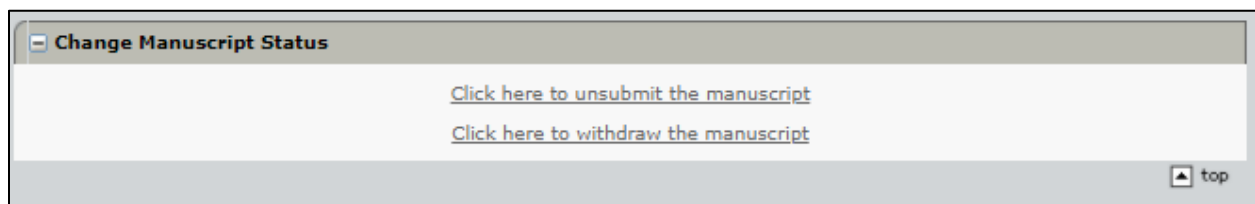
The only users with permission to withdraw manuscripts are editors and admins. If you are not an editor or admin and get a request that fits the above requirements, please email the details to [manuscripts@sciencesocieties.org](mailto:manuscripts@sciencesocieties.org). Please include the following information with your request:

- The manuscript id
- The reason for withdrawing
- Confirmation from the author that they would like to withdraw the paper
- Any other pertinent information or files

### Unsubmitting a manuscript (Editors only)

If you are an editor who receives a withdrawal request, you may do so from the “Manuscript Files” tab.

At the bottom of the page, under the file list, you will see two links, one for unsubmitting the manuscript, and one for withdrawing the manuscript.



Click the withdraw link, and an email will open. Add any relevant information, then hit send.
